HEALTH COVERAGE FOR ALL CHILDREN REGARDLESS OF IMMIGRATION STATUS

I am proud to partner with the ALL IN For Health Campaign, a project of The Children's Partnership and schools like yours, to encourage and help families enroll their children in health care coverage.

I would like to share a new and exciting opportunity for the increased well-being of children across California. Last year, California passed legislation that allows all low-income undocumented children and youth under nineteen years of age to enroll in full-scope Medi-Cal. Medi-Cal coverage will provide previously ineligible undocumented children access to the full array of health care services they need to stay healthy and ready to learn.

The expansion of full-scope Medi-Cal to undocumented children begins on May 16, 2016. Families should apply for restricted-scope Medi-Cal for their children as soon as possible. Children who are enrolled in restricted-scope Medi-Cal (also known as emergency Medi-Cal) will be automatically enrolled into full-scope Medi-Cal when the expansion begins on May 16, 2016.

I hope you and your school are ALL IN and will join me by sharing this information about Medi-Cal expansion and by connecting with families with undocumented children to help them enroll in coverage.
